

## PIPELINE ENHANCEMENT

One of our top priorities is providing you with safe and reliable energy. To do this, we make improvements to our system. We have a plan underway to enhance our natural gas pipeline throughout our service area. I want to let you know we'll be in your community soon to perform pressure testing and replacement on sections of one of our natural gas pipelines.

**Project Details:**

<b>Projected Start Date:</b>	March 2017
<b>Projected End Date:</b>	July 2017, although weather/other factors could affect the schedule.
<b>Construction Locations:</b>	This phase of construction will take place in the City of La Mesa, starting at Date Avenue and ending just North of the intersection at Baltimore Drive and El Cajon Boulevard.
<b>Road Closures:</b>	Sections of Date Avenue near the intersection of Date and Allison Avenue will be intermittently closed. All traffic will be controlled by cones, signage and flaggers.
<b>Construction Times:</b>	Both night and day work is planned and will take place as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Night work along Baltimore Drive is planned to take place Sunday through Thursday from 7:30 p.m. – 7:30 a.m. Some work along Baltimore Drive will take place during the day from Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m.</li><li>• Day work along Date Avenue and at City Hall is planned to take place Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m.</li></ul>
<b>No Service Interruption:</b>	Your gas service should continue without interruption however if something changes, an SDG&E representative will contact you.
<b>Access:</b>	Our work will not limit access to your property; but please anticipate traffic delays because of the construction.

**What to expect**


Sections of Date Avenue near the intersection of Date and Allison Avenue will be intermittently closed. All traffic will be controlled by cones, signage and flaggers. During construction, road closures, lane closures and detours will be in place to assist the flow of traffic. In the construction areas, traffic control cones, signs and flaggers will be used as needed.

**The odor of natural gas**

You may smell the odor of natural gas and hear a loud, steady noise as we vent natural gas from the pipeline using safe and common techniques. Although this is normal when crews are working, we encourage anyone who has concerns about the smell of gas to call us from a safe location at **1-800-611-7343**.

We apologize in advance for any inconvenience our work may cause you. Please know your patience and cooperation is appreciated. Your gas service should continue without interruption.
